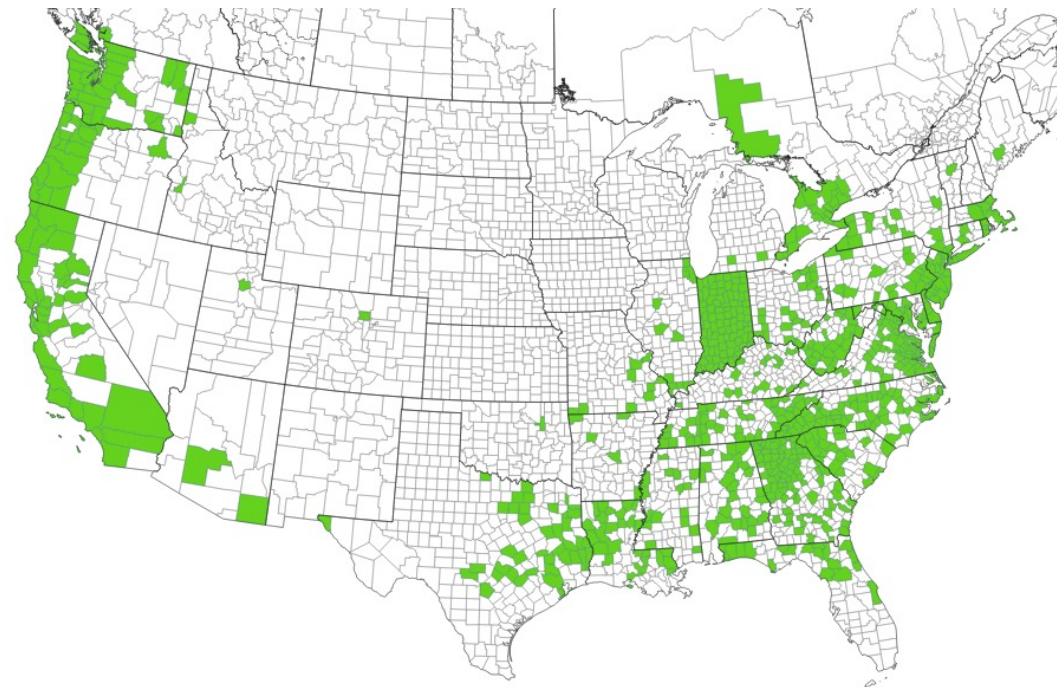


# English ivy (*Hedera helix*)



- Woody vine with evergreen leaves; climbs via sticky aerial roots
- Habitats it invades:
  - Forests
  - Roadsides
- Status
  - Wisconsin: Not Regulated (not escaped here yet)





# English ivy (*Hedera helix*)

*Leaves alternate, simple*

- 2-4" long, palmately-lobed, variable in shape
- Leaves are evergreen, somewhat leathery

## Flower/fruit

- Flowers are small, greenish-yellow
- Flowers borne in rounded clusters at the tips of stems; late summer
- Fruit is a berry



# English ivy look alike



The **native** poison-ivy (*Toxicodendron radicans*) climbs via aerial roots but differs from English ivy (*Hedera helix*) in its deciduous, trifoliate leaves.
