Barberry look alikes



Japanese barberry (*Berberis* thunbergii) and common barberry (*Berberis vulgaris*) may be confused with gooseberries (*Ribes spp.*), especially in the winter, since gooseberries are also shrubs with spines along their stems.

During the growing season, leaf size and shape makes it easy to differentiate these species.

Gooseberries have 3+ lobes per leaf and barberries have unlobed leaves.

During the winter, one trick to differentiate these plants is to peel the outer layer of the bark.

The inner bark of barberry is fluorescent yellow!



Barberry leaves (above) are simple and unlobed. Gooseberry leaves are simple but have 3+ lobes (below).
