Impatiens species look alikes



The invasive *Impatiens*, Balfour's touch-me-not (*Impatiens balfourii*) and policeman's helmet (*I. glandulifera*), may be confused with the native jewelweeds, spotted touch-me-not (*I. capensis*) and pale touch-me not (*I. pallida*).

Spotted touch-me-not (Impatiens capensis)	Alternate	Oval to egg-shaped; hairless; widely spaced teeth; up to 3" long, 1 1/2" wide; stalks up to 1" long	Orange, sometimes with reddish spots; long spur curves under the tube; groups of 1-3
Pale touch-me-not (Impatiens pallida)	Alternate	Oval to egg-shaped; hairless; toothed; up to 5" long, 3" wide; stalks up to 2" long	Yellow, sometimes with reddish spots; narrow spur in back bends down; groups of 1-3
