Hill mustard look alikes



Hill mustard (*Bunias orientalis*) has clusters of 4-petaled yellow flowers, which means it can be confused with several members of the mustard family.



HILL MUSTARD (*Bunias orientalis*) blooms in **late spring**.

Leaf shape can be variable, but leaves characterized by point at the tip of the leaf, warty bumps, slight hairiness, and a strong cabbage odor when crushed.

Seed pods are teardrop shaped and irregularly bumpy.



YELLOW ROCKETS (Barbarea spp.)
bloom April - June
Leaves are lobed, rounded at the tip,
hairless, with no bumps and no cabbage
odor.

Seed pods are long and slender.



YELLOW CRESSES (Rorippa spp.)
bloom April – July (R. sinuata) + June –
Sept (R. sylvestris)
Leaves are deeply lobed, with no
bumps and no cabbage odor.

Seed pods are **long and slender**.
