

Hill mustard look alike

Hill mustard (*Bunias orientalis*) has clusters of 4-petaled yellow flowers, which means it can be confused with several members of the mustard family.



HILL MUSTARD (*Bunias orientalis*) blooms in
late spring.

Leaf shape can be variable, but leaves
characterized by **point at the tip of the leaf,**
warty bumps, slight hairiness, and a strong
cabbage odor when crushed.

Seed pods are **teardrop shaped** and **irregularly**
bumpy.



YELLOW ROCKETS (*Barbarea spp.*)
bloom April - June
Leaves are lobed, **rounded at the tip,**
hairless, with no bumps and no cabbage
odor.

Seed pods are **long and slender.**



YELLOW CRESSES (*Rorippa spp.*)
bloom April – July (*R. sinuata*) + **June –**
Sept (*R. sylvestris*)

Leaves are **deeply lobed, with no**
bumps and no cabbage odor.
Seed pods are **long and slender.**
