
## Perennial knotweed comparison



Perennial knotweeds (Fallopia spp.) have tall, arching stems that resemble bamboo. The three species in Wisconsin look most like each other and are not often confused with other species. Bohemian knotweed is a hybrid of Japanese knotweed and giant knotweed, so it has characteristics that are intermediary between the other two species.



Species	Stem	Leaves
Japanese knotweed (Fallopia japonica)	Multiple branches; up to 10 ft tall	4-6" long; squared off leaf base
Giant knotweed (Fallopia sachalinensis)	Few or no branches; 10-20+ ft tall	6-14" long; heart-shaped base
Bohemian knotweed ( <i>Fallopia x bohemicum</i> )	Few to several branches; 6-10 ft tall	4-6+" long; base intermediate between squared off and heart-shaped
