Mile-a-minute vine look alikes



Mile-a-minute vine (*Persicaria perfoliata / Polygonum perfoliatum*) may be confused with our native tearthumbs (*Persicaria arifolia / Polygonum arifolium* and *Persicaria sagittata / Polygonum sagitattum*). These vines all have weak, prickly stems and triangular leaves.



Mile-a-minute vine stems are reddish and covered in barbs.

Leaves are equilateral triangles with barbs on the undersides.

Cup-shaped leaves along the stem are below clusters of flowers and then pea-size metallic blue fruits.



Native tearthumbs have **bristles along the stems**. Leaves are **triangular to arrowhead-shaped**, with lower leaves having triangular lobes at the base. The leaves below flower clusters are **lance-shaped**. Fruits are dry seeds.
