Rubus species look alikes



Himalayan blackberry (*Rubus armeniacus*) and wine raspberry (*Rubus phoenicolasius*) are two invasive *Rubus* species among several native and cultivated *Rubus* species in Wisconsin.



HIMALAYAN BLACKBERRY has pinkish to white flowers.
Like the native high-bush blackberry (R. allegheniensis),
Himalayan blackberry has large, angular stems with
large spines. Both have hooked thorns on the midvein
on the underside of the leaf. Leaves are white-silver
underneath (similar to raspberries), while native
blackberry leaves are green on both sides.



WINE RASPBERRY has flowers with sepals longer than the petals, giving the appearance of being unopened. Sepals and stems are covered in glandular reddish hairs. Leaves with woolly-white hairs on underside. Native raspberries with glandular hairs have hairs not longer than the prickles.
